NIRCL DNA POLICY UPDATES
June 2018

- The use of the FBI DNA database to identify a person in possession of a firearm or of controlled substance/packaging is prohibited. A suspect reference standard must be submitted for direct comparison to any DNA profile developed from the firearm or controlled substance/packaging in question.

- Additionally, suspect reference standards are analyzed to compare DNA profiles to those developed from DNA evidence. If there is no DNA evidence submitted in a case, or if evidence from a case does not meet the NIRCL DNA acceptance policy, suspect standards will not be processed for entry into the DNA database.

- Finally, please be aware that swabs of items which were “moved” during a non-violent crime are considered Touch-Type DNA evidence and are not routinely accepted for analysis.
