POSITION SUMMARY

The primary duties of the NIBIN Technician are to process firearms and firearms related evidence as part of the department's ballistic imaging program. Specific duties of the NIBIN Technician may include but are not limited to, performing the following duties with little or no direct supervision:

- Using a computerized evidence management and information system (LIMS)
- Maintaining chain of custody
- Performing safety inspections and forensically function tests for all firearm types
- Identifying various ammunition types
- Test firing of all firearm types
- Data entry of casings into Integrated Ballistic Identification System (IBIS)
- Issuing reports pertaining to work performed
- Testifying in court
- Preparing chemical reagents and solutions
- Maintaining instruments and equipment such as trigger pull gauges, calipers, water bullet recovery tank, etc.
- Assist in laboratory validation studies

MINIMUM EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Ability to achieve a bachelor's degree to include courses in the natural sciences, Forensic Science, or a closely related field within 12 months of employment.

PREFERRED EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

- Experience in handling and use of firearms
